The health effects of climate change are hitting the *most fragile* communities the hardest.


Extreme heat, the spread of infectious diseases, and food and water insecurity are imminent threats.





Local actors are uniquely positioned to drive adaptation to these health impacts.

However, finance for locally led health adaptation is nowhere near what is needed.



Only 10% of global climate finance reaches the local level.

Four barriers prevent finance from reaching local actors:



Funding for climate, health and locally-led adaptation is not sufficient or fit for purpose.



There is limited evidence on "what works" for locally-led health adaptation, leading to a risk-focused approach to funding.



Power imbalances exclude communities from funding decisions.



Competing priorities constrain local actors' capacity to develop successful funding proposals.
